Their key objectives are; 1) To Provide Remedial Support For Academically Challenged, Special Needs Children And Young People To Enable Them To Blossom.2) Support For Families With A Special Needs Child, And Social And Recreational Activities To Young People. In the UK, there is approximately one learning disabled child in every twenty, yet the majority of families that BB work with report feeling like they are alone in their journey. BB exists to reduce this isolation and to ensure that families get the support that they need in order to support their disabled children fully.</p> <p>2016/17 £320 2017/18 £482.80 2019/20 £806 2022/23 £500 2023/24 £920</p> | <p>In November 2016 we made a grant to buy Disabled Support Grab Bars for a new gym sited in a local school focused on helping disabled and challenged children. The gym will create opportunities for therapists and support assistants to work with the children and help them realise their potential. In January 2018 we made another grant in partnership with the Rhiannon Trust to purchase a defibrillator for their Happy Haven Therapy Centre. At the back of their centre is a garden space which is currently empty. In Sept 2019 our grant purchased garden equipment for the children to use between sessions, as part of therapy practice and for holiday play schemes. Like, all other kids, these children need a safe space to play, laugh and create friendships. These activities provide a lifeline to the families and their children. The after school play haven and therapy centre giving disabled children a safe space after school, to hang out and have fun. There are also complementary therapies such as, OT, Music, Drama, art, and SLT.</p> <p>In 2022 and 2023 we supported the "Share a Pair" project bringing essential clothing and footwear to local children living in poverty.</p> | £3,029 |

They feed the whole family, one hot healthy meal, delivered to their door once every week, with enough additional ingredients to cook another simple meal in the week.</p> | <p>We made our first grant to fund meals and slow cookers that will help many families in this area of Wiltshire in 2022.</p> <p>Their guiding principle is: No Fuss - No Forms - No Referrals ... Just Food for Families who need it. The trustees, staff and large numbers of volunteers are committed to improving the quality of life of people facing disadvantage in the local area. We seek to build community involvement in the running of community groups and activities and to contribute to the regeneration of the local area. We have secured funding from a range of supporters, mainly locally based, that allows us to undertake our work. Collaborating with other charities and organisations is an important part of our approach.</p> | <p>Triple C and the people who run it are a great example of locally based charities serving their communities. They bring the community together and focus on improving life by working with the people they serve. Team Action (TA) develop young people's capabilities, confidence, skills and wellbeing, helping them to reach their potential and secure jobs.</p> <p>Their activities improve emotional, social and intellectual attainment. They offer a variety of successful programmes for more than 210 beneficiaries annually including a variety of vocational training as well as some accredited programmes such as Childcare NVQ, IT certificate and diploma, IFS Financial capabilities and much more.</p> <p>Many of these young people - the majority drawn from marginalised BME groups - hail from poverty-stricken and overcrowded living conditions, and lack mainstream social/educational opportunities.</p> <p>Teen Action are committed to quality and excellent youth work and are holders of the London Youth Gold Quality Mark, a programme accredited by City & Guilds.</p> | <p>Convert a small kitchenette into a fully functional SEN room with 2 computers, comfortable chairs, calming lighting and décor and learning aids. This facility will cater annually for approximately 20 young people with additional learning needs as well as over 200 Teen Action members at their 1:1 career guidance meetings.
