It's about community and social welfare. Swings & Smiles had 798 individual contacts through Outreach in 2022. There have been many challenges along the way but the charity goes from strength to strength.	Their Outreach Project takes play out to groups, schools and others within a 40 mile radius. It offers comprehensive support free of charge to disabled children and their families. They can reach those who are most isolated, perhaps due to their own lack of confidence or the challenges they experience as a result of their disability. Families of children with disabilities often struggle to find play and socialisation opportunities. S&S provide home visits to their most vulnerable families. Our 2023/24 grant will fund specialist play equipment for the children. We have joined with Downs School in Berkshire on a matched funding project to help the charity's cooking initiative. Cooking is an important life skill that can increase independence, improve health outcomes and help individuals to budget and save money. The residents have faced issues such as addiction, bereavement, unemployment, relationship breakdown and the criminal justice system. The residents are offered accommodation, advice and support to place them in a stronger position, to eventually maintain a tenancy in the longer term. Since the purchase of the first house we have provided more than 13,000 nights' accommodation for people who would otherwise have been homeless We are flexible in our approach, responding proactively, this responsiveness is why our model is successful. Our Board of Trustees are all from the local community including vicars, church and community representatives and trustees from community-related agencies. The trustees, staff and large numbers of volunteers are committed to improving the quality of life of people facing disadvantage in the local area. We seeks to build community involvement in the running of community groups and activities and to contribute to the regeneration of the local area. We have secured funding from a range of supporters, mainly locally based, that allows us to undertake our work. Collaborating with other charities and organisations is an important part of our approach.	Triple C and the people who run it are a great example of locally based charities serving their communities. They bring the community together and focus on improving life by working with the people they serve. Once we found this charity it was not long before we made a grant to buy basic food stuffs for their Food Pantry but being Christmas we all thought some treats like chocolates or biscuits should find their way into what would be distributed to those most in need.
