The first point of contact is with people on the streets, offering practical assistance, support and information. From this point they offer continued assistance that enables people to secure suitable accommodation, support them in maintaining their tenancies, and help them to access initiatives that carry their lives forward. They provide a weekend breakfast and over the Christmas period three meals every day. Other projects include Crisis Management, digital inclusion, fighting food poverty and an arts programme to give people a chance to express themselves. In addition to care and dealing with immediate needs they provide the opportunity for people to reconnect with the society and communities in which they live.
